




HISTORY

The early ideas for Togwotee Mountain Lodge began in 1873 when the U.S. Army Corp. of Engineers decided to build a road over Togwotee Pass. (Pronounced TOE-GUH-TEE) The pass was named after the Native American guide who helped the Corp. to navigate the pass. The name has held on and continues to be memorialized by Togwotee Moutain Lodge. "Togwotee" means "lance thrower" or "exactly there," and was often used as part of a lance-throwing game. Some translate the term to mean, "from here you can go anywhere," which still resonated with visitors today. The main building at Togwotee Mountain Lodge was built in 1965 and in 1995, 54 log cabins were constructed nestled among the pines.









TOGWOTEE MOUNTAIN LODGE:

Togwotee Mountain Lodge is open for winter and summer. The winter season runs from early December to March, while the summer open dates are from May to September. The lodge has amenities such as on-site dining, a bar and lounge, free parking, and laundry facilities. The lodge is pet-friendly.

If you're planning to stay at the lodge, you can choose between Lodge Rooms, Suites, and private Cabins. At the lodge, you'll find 28 western pine Lodge Rooms with vaulted ceilings, two queen beds, and a private bathroom. Lodge Suites are 300 square feet and are perfect for families. Each suite includes a queen bed, twin-size bunk bed, sleeper sofa, mini-fridge, microwave, and full bathroom.

The Cabins at Togwotee Mountain Lodge are 400 square feet and include a bedroom, bathroom, living room, and kitchenette. The cabins comfortably sleeps four to six people.




































ACTIVITIES



WINTER ADVENTURES WITH THE TETON TOUR COMPANY:

When it comes to winter activities near Togwotee, head over to the Teton Tour Company. Hop aboard a snowmobile and choose just the right tour for you. You can see the sights on a one-day tour, join an adventure tour to the continental divide, or take a tour focused on seeing the local wildlife. With over 600 miles of groomed trails, these mountains are home to some of the best snowmobiling in the world.



FLOAT THE RIVER WITH **SANDS WHITEWATER & SCENIC RIVER TOURS:**

During the summer when there's no snow, you'll want to head off to Sands Whitewater & Scenic River Tours. Take your pick between calm scenic river tours or whitewater rafting down the Snake River. Professional guides will offer you safety tips, point out wildlife and famous scenery, and share facts about local history.

As one of the largest rafting companies in Jackson Hole, you're certain to find just the right level of adventure on your rafting tour. On the whitewater rafting tour, you might get wet while experiencing Class II and III rapids. If you choose the scenic river tour, your guide will take care of the paddling, all you have to do is enjoy the trip and snap photos.




SNOWMOBILING:

With over 600 miles of snowmobile trails and annual snowfall of over 500 inches, making for some of the best snowmobiling in the world. Rent a snowmobile for trail riding, take a guided tour, or, if you're an experienced rider, head off trail for an epic adventure.

















DOG SLED TOURS:

Sit back, relax, and let dog power take you through the backcountry of Grand Teton National Park. Before you're whisked off for your tour, you'll get 15 minutes to meet the dogs, greet your guides, get your warm gear on, and take pictures.



HIKING:

Just out the front door of Togwotee Mountain Lodge, you'll find plenty of hiking trails. Head over to Angle Summit Trail, which is named after Al and Bertha Angle who established the lodge in 1913. The trail up the mountain is 1.5 miles and takes about two hours to reach the top. Along the way, you'll get to traverse open fields and take in mountaintop views.



HORSEBACK RIDING:

For full enjoyment of the American West, you'll want to book a horseback riding tour. Trail ride among some of the most pristine wilderness in the country. Along the way, you'll get a chance to see wildlife such as elk, deer, moose, and others.



SEASONAL

Each season in Jackson Hole has its own magic. No matter what time of year you visit Yellowstone, the Grand Tetons, Bridger-Teton, or Togwotee Pass, you'll find something fun and magical to do.



WINTER:

In winter, you'll find a winter wonderland of frosty trees, steamy geysers, and snow-covered landscape. The rivers remain unfrozen throughout the season and are a refuge for waterfowl. The snow makes this the perfect place for cross-country skiing, snowmobiling, and downhill skiing.



SPRING:

As the snows begin to thaw, you'll know that spring has arrived. While the temperatures can remain cool, wildflowers begin to bloom in the fields. You'll find fantastic whitewater rafting as the rivers surge with snowmelt, hungry trout, and birds returning from their winter habitats.



SUMMER:

Summer brings warmer temperatures and more activities. Mountain trails open for summer hiking, and adventurers spend as much time as possible outdoors camping, kayaking, fishing, and biking.



FALL:

In the fall, the area sees fewer visitors, cooler temperatures, and hunting season. The weather stays nice into mid-October and until the roads close at the end of October. As fall slips away to winter, you'll see snow at lower and lower elevations.



EVENTS CALENDAR:

Jackson Hole, Wyoming is all about the seasons. During the summer, you'll get warm days and cool nights that are perfect for spending time outside, floating the rivers, and enjoying the wildlife. Then, when the snow falls, it's all about snowmobiling and dog sledding. Visitors get to enjoy the winter wonderland that is Jackson Hole in the winter.







SUSTAINABILITY ACTIONS:

At Togwotee Mountain Lodge, we have a deep respect for nature and have committed to protecting and improving the environment. We have made changes to our operations to limit our impact on the environment and work with our guests to help them also do their part.



The national parks surrounding Togwotee Mountain Lodge are home to thousands of species of plant and animal life. During your visit, be sure to keep your camera ready for rare bird sightings. At Bridger-Teton National Forest, you'll find a nature scavenger hunt where you can help look for common animals and plants.



Whether you're an amateur birder or a professional, you're sure to want a set of binoculars for your birdwatching in Togwotee. If you forgot your own, head over to the gift shop to some binoculars and get back to bird spotting.

PACKING LIST:

Your packing list for Jackson Hole, Wyoming will depend on which time of year you're planning to visit. In the summer, you'll get warm days and cool nights. Even in the summer, you'll want to pack plenty of layers so you can add or remove layers depending on the weather. Winter is all about the snow and snow activities, so be sure to bring waterproof, warm clothing.

Your summer packing list should include:


- Wind and waterproof layer
- Brimmed hat, sunglasses, & sunscreen
- Waterproof boots
- Wool socks

Your winter packing list should include:

- Plenty of warm and waterproof layering options
- Warm, insulated boots
- Wool hat, socks, gloves, & long underwear for warmth
- Sunglasses and ski goggles
- Winter jacket with hood
- Neck gator
- Insulated mittens
- Insulated, GORE-TEX® pants for snow activities

PARK ENTRANCE FEES:

Nearby Togwotee Mountain Lodge, you'll find Yellowstone National Park and Grand Teton National Park. Both parks charge a small entrance fee, which is good for 7 days in the park.















